

The Master's degree in European and Global Studies (EGoS) provides a comprehensive understanding of political and institutional issues, focusing on both European and global perspectives.

By developing specialist knowledge, skills, and analytical tools, students gain cutting-edge insights into political, historical, social, and economic phenomena and acquire up-to-date knowledge on the latest political and policy developments, globally and in the EU.

This background facilitates the understanding, development, and management of political and policy strategies, measures, and projects across multiple territorial scales and policy fields.

The Master's degree allows graduates to navigate multi-actor and multi-level settings. fostering their critical thinking and decision-making capacity in the areas of European and global affairs.

A MULTIDISCIPLINARY TRAINING

Common path (for all students):

Global Policymaking, EU Policymaking, Global history, Social Science Methodology, English as a Glocal Language, European and Global Economics, European and International Law.

Four study tracks:

- European focus: multidisciplinary analysis of the main policy and governance challenges that the European Union is facing.
- Global focus: how governance, communication and digital transformations intersect emerging policy and societal challenges on a global scale.
- Geopolitical challenges: the main security. fundamental rights, climate and social justice challenges emerging from the evolving geopolitical scenario.
- Social challenges: the main current global social challenges and their consequences in terms of inequality and limited social justice.

International Economics, Management, Cooperation and Development, Intercultural Communication, Media and Cultural Studies, International Law, Linguistics, Political Philosophy, Geography, Psychology, Sociology, History;
- English language: **B2 level** (CEFR) or equivalent.

Holding an Italian diploma students:

- Bachelor's degree belonging to class L-5. L-14 L-36 e L-37 (Ministerial Decree 270/2004) or class 02, 15, 29 e 35 (Ministerial Decree 509/1999) or Bachelor's degree belonging to any class and possession of the minimum curricular requirements according to the Call for admission for Master's degrees with unlimited places and admission requirements;
- Final graduation mark higher than or equal to 100/110 or equivalent:
- English language: **B2 level** (CEFR).
