4. Criteria related to linguistic knowledge

Linguistic knowledge is assessed for one language for each chosen destination according to:

- the requirements indicated by the Host University
- the language in which the courses will be taught during the exchange.

If the student proposes to undertake activities in more than one language, language proficiency will only be assessed for the main language of instruction of the chosen university.

It is possible to obtain a score in one of the following ways:

a) **LANGUAGE EXAM**

Students who have passed the **language exam** required by their study plan, or during their previous degree if they are students at Master Level, acquire a score of the sum of:

Romanian, Polish, Modern Greek, Hungarian, Lithuanian, Latvian, Norwegian, Slovenian, Swedish, Danish, Finnish, etc. may also be considered as curricular language exams if the student proposes to take courses in that language at the partner institution.

Only exams registered in the booklet by the date indicated in the call for applications or, in the case of exams taken at other universities, certified by attaching the degree certificate with transcript of records will be considered.

b) TAL

Students who have taken the University Language Centre (Centro Linguistico Ateneo CLA) assessment test named TAL acquire a vote in relation to the level passed: according with the following scheme:

In the case of TAL B1 or B2 certificates covering more than one skill (e.g. reading and listening certificate and oral production certificate), the points are added together.

You must attach your Open Badge(s) to your application (certificate showing your name and surname) or self-certify in the "Additional information" section that you have passed the TAL, stating the date on which you took the test.

c) OFFICIAL LINGUISTIC CERTIFICATION

Students submitting an official linguistic certification obtained within the last three years, included the year in which they are participating in the call (for example, for the call 2022/23 certified after 01/01/2020) by recognized institutions from the University of Padova and clearly indicated on the website of the University of Padova (https://drive.google.com/file/d/1WMC1OBxwORCYH1f5qBS2A_RRS9e13OUt/view) acquire a score in relation to the language level certified:

A1 = 1 point, A2 = 2 points, B1 = 6 points, B2 = 11 points, C1 = 13 points, C2 = 14 points Certification must be attached.

d) OLS test

Students can also submit the OLS test of a previous Erasmus+ mobility, which will be awarded: A1 = 1 point, A2 = 2 points, B1 = 4 points, B2 = 9 points, C1 = 11 points, C2 = 12 points The test result must be attached to the application.

e) ESABAC

Students who have obtained the Esabac Diploma will be awarded 11 points for the French language. The diploma must be attached to the application.

f) BACHELOR DEGREE TAUGHT IN ENGLISH

Those who have obtained a Bachelor's degree taught in English in Italy or abroad will obtain 11 points for the English language.

A degree certificate and diploma supplement or other evidence of the language of instruction of the programme must be attached to the application.

g) NATIVE SPEAKERS

Native speakers can be awarded 14 points. A student is considered a native speaker if he/she has attended at least the entire secondary school cycle and has obtained the relative diploma (corresponding to the DIPLOMA DI MATURITA) in the country where the language being assessed is considered an official language.

A copy of the diploma certification and self-certification must be attached to the application.

h) ERASMUS LANGUAGE ASSESSMENT

Ad hoc tests for the Erasmus language assessment may be organised once a year when the call for applications is published by the department's language teachers, subject to their availability. The organisation of tests for all languages is therefore not guaranteed.

The assessment has no exam value and does not attribute credits, is valid only for the purposes of the ranking list for the call for applications and does not entitle the student to any certifications that may be required by the Partner Institutions.

The available tests and dates are communicated when the first call for applications is published.

The student will gain a result from the sum of:

1. a score corresponding to the reference level:

If the student has multiple attestations of language, it is his/her responsibility to submit those that are most beneficial to the application (one for each language).

Only one method will be considered for a single language for each destination indicated in the application.

5. Erasmus Commission Points: FROM 0 TO 6 POINTS

In the case of **dubious** or **problematic applications and situations** (eg. anomalous Learning Agreement for content or number of scheduled exams; thesis activities without tutor at the Partner Institution; equal situations; meaning equivalent and multiple applications for highly preferred locations; specific curricular needs) the decision will be referred to a committee made up of 'Referenti Erasmus' (*Erasmus Coordinator for Degree programme*) and Academic Coordinators involved, who can assign up to 6 points based on:

- --- draft of the study plan for activities abroad and congruence of the proposed activities with the student's university career
- --- interview / motivations expressed by the student

6. Points for thesis work abroad

Students who intend to apply for thesis work abroad will have to attach a letter from their supervisor at the Università di Padova and an acceptance letter from the supervisor abroad who will follow their activity during the mobility period (also via email). Following the presentation of these declarations, additional points will be assigned as follows:

- 6 points for Bachelor's students
- 10 points for Master's students

7. Second Erasmus+ mobility

Priority will be given to students who have not previously benefited from an Erasmus grant over those who have already benefited from an Erasmus grant during their current cycle of studies.

8. Degree courses

For certain bilateral agreements for specific degree courses, students enrolled in these courses will have priority in the list of successful students.

9. PhD Students

For PhD applicants, the list of successful students will be stipulated by the relevant Erasmus commission (see point 5) on the basis of the validity of the submitted applications, of the proposed research work and of the certified linguistic knowledge.
