Memory Policies and Their Role in Enhancing Democratic Resilience: A Multidisciplinary Perspective

Memory policy-making has gained increasing significance in recent discussions concerning collective remembrance, transitional justice, and democratic resilience. Nevertheless, the concept remains somewhat fragmented and insufficiently theorised, resulting in the emergence of various terminologies associated with it or its components, such as memory laws. This dMSA roundtable aims to convene scholars from diverse disciplines to examine multidisciplinary perspectives on memory policies and their influence on strengthening democratic resilience, with particular emphasis on their conceptual foundations, practical implementations, especially regarding the mnemonic legitimization of subaltern memories, and normative considerations.
